

2015 Philips IMR Case of the Year Terms and Conditions

Participation in the Philips IMR Case of the Year are subject to the terms and conditions below and to applicable laws including but not limited to anti-bribery, transparency reporting, and privacy.

Submissions

- Submissions will be accepted as early as 12:00 am EST July 7th until 11:59 pm EST October 15, 2015.
- Only users of IMR may submit a case for consideration.
- The number of cases submitted by an IMR user is limited to 5.
- Cases describing off-label uses of Philips IMR are not eligible.
- Contestants are required to fill out the submission form and accept these terms and conditions on the landing page to be eligible for consideration.
- All submissions will be reviewed by a Philips CT Review Committee for eligibility. The Review Committee will determine at its sole discretion the cases eligible for Voting.
- Submissions will only be considered if Customer submits a signed Image Release form which will be sent to those who enter the contest via PhilipsCTcontest@philips.com. By signing the (Image Release form, Customer authorizes Philips Healthcare to use the de-identified Data for the purposes of research and development (e.g., for improvement of Philips products and services), marketing and other legitimate business purposes.
- By entering the contest, contestants are agreeing to be contacted and receive emails from Philips CT. I understand that by registering for the IMR Case of the Year that I may receive communications from Philips in order to administer the contest.

Voting

- Voting will be held from 12:00 am EST October 20 to 11:59 pm EST November 15, 2015
- Voting will be split between the Philips CT Review Committee and a global panel of Physicians:
- Philips CT Review Committee
 - Voting will be conducted exclusively by the Philips CT Review Committee to determine the top 10 cases
 - The Committee will use a grading card that measures 5 criteria on a scale of 1-5 (Image Quality, Dose Level, Patient/diagnosis Impact, Clinical Interest (technique, pathology), Overall).
- Philips Global Panel of Physicians
 - Voting is open to 3 Physicians (that are Philips users) around the globe and make up the Global Panel
 - Voting is limited to one vote per Physician
 - The Physicians will use a grading card that measures 5 criteria on a scale of 1-5 (Image Quality, Dose Level, Patient/diagnosis Impact, Clinical Interest (technique, pathology), Overall).
- Grand Prize, and honorable mentions will be determined by a combination of the Philips CT Review Committee and the Philips Global panel of Physicians vote. The combined vote will be calculated by combining, with equal weight, the scores of the Philips CT Review Committee vote and the Philips Global Panel of Physicians vote.

Awards

- Grand Prize
 - Awarded to the institution (the “IMR Case of the Year” winner) at which the primary submitter of the case receiving the highest combined score was in residence either at the time the work described in the case was performed or at the time the prize is awarded, at Philips option.

- In the event that two cases receive the same combined score, the Grand Prize will be split equally amongst the institutions at which the primary submitters were in residence either at the time the work described in the case was performed or at the time the prize is awarded, at Philips option.
- Customer(s) of the Grand Prize winning case and the Grand Prize Winning Institution(s) will receive publicity for their IMR Case of the Year on the IMR Global Web Site, other industry publications, and events such as RSNA at Philips discretion.
- Grand Prize Winning Institution will receive a plaque of recognition presented on the 2015 RSNA floor.
- Grand Prize Winning Institution will have their IMR Case displayed on the Philips booth at RSNA.
